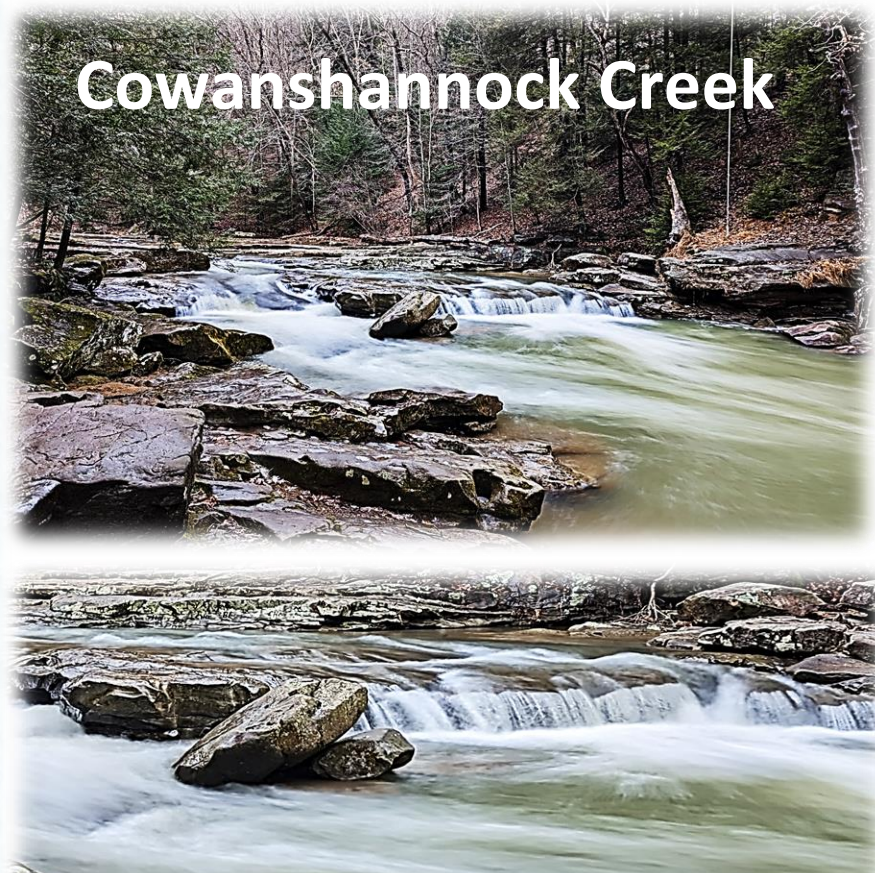


# Three Beautiful ~ Different ~ Buttermilk Falls in Western PA

## Armstrong County

The scenic Buttermilk Falls area of Cowanshannock Creek, a tributary of the Allegheny River, is a local favorite for hiking, fishing, and picnicking. The Cowanshannock Trail follows the former spur of the abandoned Pennsylvania Railroad Company, once used to access clay and coal mines.

➤ **The 1.25-mile trail to the falls starts at the Northwest corner of the parking lot.**

➤ If you cross SR 1033, you can access the Armstrong Trail, a Rail Trail that follows along the Allegheny River in Armstrong and Clarion Counties.

## Beaver County

This all-natural area features a 40-foot scenic sandstone formation and waterfall. It is an area geologically recognized as home to Homewood Sandstone used locally in bridge piers, tunnels, roadways, and construction of the Western Penitentiary in Pittsburgh.



Also known as Homewood Falls, it is an extremely pretty and accessible waterfall, one of the tallest in Western Pennsylvania at 35 feet.
